Visitors

When visitors are in your facility, they should never be left unattended. Click the highlighted icon for more information.



When a visitor comes on site, they must sign a visitor's log upon arrival and sign out when they leave the facility.



Visitors may be given a visitor tag or be required to wear outerwear—such as a smock or bump cap that is color coded—to identify them as a non-employee.



If you see a visitor without an escort or in an unauthorized area, immediately guide them to where they are supposed to be and notify your supervisor.

#### Is It Safe?



**Safe? Not a chance!** This corroded snap hook was removed from service during a recent inspection. According to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration "Personal fall protection systems must be inspected before initial use during each work shift for mildew, wear, damage, and other deterioration, and defective components must be removed from service."

It is also important to store personal fall protection equipment to prevent exposure to sunlight, extreme temperatures, and corrosive materials.
