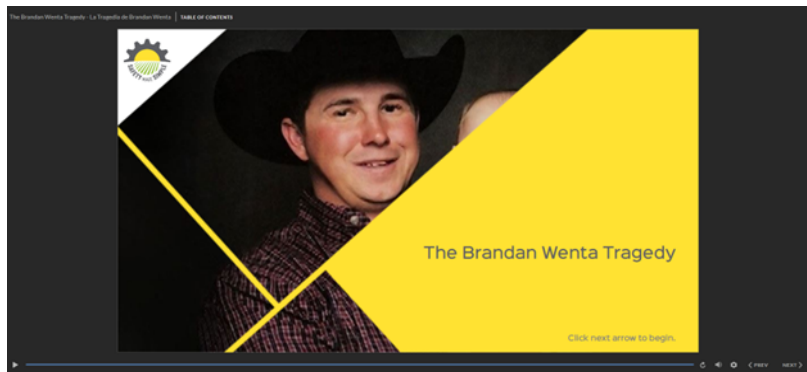
DOT Hazmat: En-Route Security

Is it Safe? No Way!

OSHA's Grain Handling Standard 29 CFR Part 1910.272 addresses grain dust explosion prevention and includes requirements for written housekeeping programs. One of the goals of OSHA's housekeeping program requirement is to reduce the potential for secondary explosions. Secondary explosions occur when the blast or pressure wave from the primary explosion propagates into areas such as gallery floors, tunnels, and intermediate floors of the headhouse causing layers of dust to become suspended. Keeping these areas clean is critical!
